I have been afforded many blessings in my lifetime, but none have been as unexpectedly life-changing and absolutely transformative as the calling I received 17 years ago.

Since Saint Martin welcomed its first class in fall of 2004, I am proud to say that together as one family we have begun to truly transform urban education in Cleveland. I look forward to remaining a part of this community, and once the next president is identified, I will shift my focus to supporting our work with strategic and community partnerships. Until that time however, I will remain the President, ensuring our continued success and a strong foundation for my successor.

There is still a lot of work to be done to ensure that we are creating access to high quality educational opportunities for all of our children. I'm ready, and I hope I can continue to count on your support as well. I ask for your prayers for our search committee and for those who may feel called to explore this opportunity. Please also pray for me as I prepare for this exciting transition.
